Babies to take center stage in Rossville this weekend

ROSSVILLE—If there's nothing like a baby to bring a smile to an adult's face, then everyone should be smiling Saturday during the first One Stop Baby Shop Pretty Baby and Halloween costume contests.

The Pretty Baby contest is open to children aged newborn to two years, said Shannon Beaupre, who, with her husband, Matt, own the baby shop.

Both contests will be held at the Rossville-Alvin High School gymnasium. Entry fee for the Pretty Baby contest is \$2, Beaupre said. The costume contest is free.

In the baby contest, boys and girls will be judged separately. First, second and third place trophies will be awarded in categories for ages 0-3 months, 4-7 months 8-12 months. 13-16 months. 17-20 months and 21-24 months. A total of 36 trophics will be awarded.

Those not winning a trophy will be eligible to win one of five personalized children's books to be given away. Beaupre said, and everyone who enters will receive a certificate.

Also, everyone who enters gets a chance to win a Little Tikes Sept 2 wagon, she said.

The costume contest is open to children ages 2

to 12. Winners will receive ribbons "and a lot of toys," Beaupre said.

All entrants in the costume contest will qualify to win a dinosaur toy box, and children will be encouraged to trick-or-treat at 11 downtown Rossville stores.

Registration for the Pretty Baby contest opens at 10:30 a.m., with judging slated for 11:30. Costume judging will follow immediately.

Judges for the contest are police chief Paul De-Witt and two Rossville firemen, Beaupre said.

The contest is not a professional one, Beaupre said. "It's just for fun," she said.

The idea for the contests came as a way of bringing new people into Rossville. "We stick out in this town," Beaupre said. "There's nowhere else that caters to children. We needed to do something that would directly affect the clientele we want to come into the shop."

Although the contests are sponsored by the baby shop, several village merchants have gotten behind the effort.

Aunt Jody donated money for all the trophies and the First National Bank of Rossville donated

An electrical problem is being blamed for a fire Tuesday in rural Hoopeston.

Hoopeston firefighters were called to a barn fire 1.5 miles south of Hoopeston on the hospital road.

According to fire chief Chuck Fenwick, the fire started when wiring malifactioned, igniting approximately 200 bales of hay and 50 bales of straw.

The barn was destroyed in the blaze, but horses kept in the structure were not harmed.

"We watched what they did," she said. "We took the ideas that we liked and incorporated them into ours."

Beaupre also talked with parents of participants in other contests to determine their likes and distilkes, such as separating boys and girls for judging. "We tried to follow their suggestions," she said.

Beaupre hopes the contest will draw at least 100 babies from a 60-mile radius of Rossville.

And she's already thinking ahead to next year's contest, saying the first effort was done "on short notice" after the couple opened the shop in July. "We've really crammed a lot in a short period of time," she said.

The contests are part of this weekend's annual Fall Festival in Rossville, sponsored by the Rossville Merchants Association.


