Voter registration information given by county clerk

Failure to advertise changes regarding voter registration for handicapped and elderly voters has prompted a special message from Lynn Foster, Vermilion County clerk.

By law, those who cannot get out to register may be registered at home by an employee of the clerk's office.

Anyone who wishes to register but is unable to leave home should contact Foster's office at 431-2611.

Today is the last day to register for the Nov. 8 election.

Those unable to leave home may not only register at home, but may vote by absentee ballot. Ab-

sentee applications must be sent to the clerk's office by Nov. 3.

Those interested in voting may go to Foster's office in the county courthouse annex at 6 N. Vermilion, Danville. The office will be open until 7 p.m. today.

Deputy registrars and precinct committeemen, as well as at the driver's license office and library may also register voters.

Those interested in registering must present at least two forms of identification, including one with a current address.

Former resident to appear on national morning show

A former Hoopeston resident can be seen on a national morning show today.

Toni Hurd, daughter of George and Katie Bobis, will appear on ABC's Good Morning America.

The segment, tentatively scheduled to air between 7 and 7:30 a.m., will feature a museum owned and operated by Hurd and her husband, Jim.

The Chicago museum, called the Bicycle Museum of America, features antique bicycles and paraphernalia relating to cycles of days gone by, said Katie Bobis.

Mrs. Hurd is expected to wear a Victorian costume when she rides a Covenant bicycle from the 1800s, during the broadcast.

Part of the segment will be live from the museum, while part was taped, Bobis said.

In fact, the segment was to air earlier, but was

preempted when U.S. troops entered Haiti. "They had too much on that," Bobis said.

The couple opened the museum approximately two years ago, Bobis said. About 200 bicycles from throughout time are featured.

The museum resulted from Bobis' son-in-law's passion for bicycles. "Jim was a bicycle maniac from day one," Bobis said. "If anybody knows anything about bicycles, it's him."

Hurd, originally from Ann Arbor, Mich., operated a small bicycle museum there, while holding down a job. He quit his job and moved to Chicago, where he works in the museum full time. "He's an entrepreneur," Bobis said. "So far, he's done very well."

That her son-in-law will be on television is no surprise to Bobis. "He's good for tv," she said.

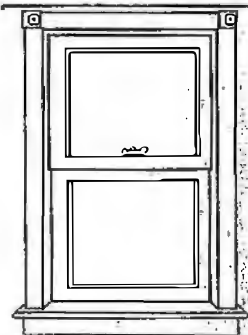
