Police officer plans bike identification program

A Hoopeston police officer is planning a program that may cut down on stolen bicycles in the city.

Officer Jim Goodrum will hold a bicycle identification program beginning at 9 a.m. Oct. 23 at the west side of the police station.

Goodrum, assisted by two auxiliary officers, will stamp identification numbers on the bottom of bicycle frames, allowing police to keep a record of bike owners.

Goodrum hopes the program will cut down on the number of bicycles stolen. "If (bicycle thieves) know that it is stamped, they won't take them home;" he said.

The program may also help police unite missing bicycles with their owners.

Currently, the police station houses about 25 bi-

cycles which have been found throughout Hoopeston,, none of which have been claimed by their owners. "After a couple weeks, kids forget (their bikes were stolen,)" he said. "Their parents go out and buy them another one. It'll make it a lot easier for us to return bicycles and a lot easier for people to get their bikes back."

The identification program may solve another problem, that of children thinking that another child's bike is theirs.

Goodrum said recently, a boy thought he had located his bicycle at another child's house. "Everything was identical," Goodrum said. "But the paperwork showed it wasn't his. This will keep that from happening."

The identification program is free and open to all Hoopeston residents.
