## Licensing going up, side walls coming down in city

Owning a dog in Hoopeston will be more expensive, if a proposed ordinance passes the city council.

Mayor Bob Ault suggested at Tuesday night's meeting that the city licensing fee be increased, the first increase since 1983.

Currently, tags for male dogs and spayed females is \$2. The licensing fee for an unspayed female is \$10. "The current rates aren't enough to pay for the paperwork," Ault said.

Ault suggested the price be increased to \$5 for males and spayed females and \$15 for unspayed females.

Alderman Bill Goodwine said he would favor an increase if a majority of people licensed their pets. "but I don't want to stick it to the people honest enough to pay." he said.

## Detection is key during Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Many women have been sporting pink ribbons lately, but they're not wearing them in their hair. The ribbons, worn on shirts, blouses and even purses, are a reminder that "Early Detection is the Key" during October, national Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

According to information published by the Illinois Department of Public Health, warning signs of breast cancer include a thickening in the breast or armpit; a change in the size or shape of the breast, discharge from the nipple; or a change in the color or texture of the breast skin. Pain is not usually a sign of cancer.

Thousands of women die from breast cancer each year. Many of those deaths could have been Ault estimated the number of residents who license their dogs at 70 percent.

City attorney Calvin Hultquist will draw up an ordinance with the new fees.

In other action, the council approved setting a 10-foot limit on side walls of accessory buildings in residential areas.

Accessory buildings, such as barns and garages could be as tall as 65 feet under existing ordinances, Hultquist said.

Under the planned change, anyone constructing an accessory building with side walls more than 10 feet high would need a conditional use prior to construction.

The change, which will require a new ordinance, was made after complaints from residents about pole barns in residential area.






