## Resident questions safety of improved Fifth St.

Improvements on Fifth Street have at least one resident questioning how safe the street will be when it opens later this week.

Tina Andel, a student at Hoopeston Area High School, appeared at Tuesday's city council meeting to request Children at Play signs be posted along the street to slow traffic.

Because the street was repaired with Federal Aid to Urban road money, Fifth Street must now be a through street, without stop signs.

That, Andel said, will cause problems. "I'm a teenager," Andel told the council. "I know how teenagers are. They go fast."

Andel told the council that residents on Fifth Street got a taste of what would happen when the street was recently open for two days. "You would not believe the people who went down there and how fast they were going," she said.

Police chief Orval Kaag told the council the speed limit on Fifth Street will be the same as on

other city streets - 25 miles per hour - and that officers will patrol the street as time allows.

Andel requested that Children at Play signs be mandatory at residences that have daycare centers, including three in her neighborhood, to keep children safe. "I don't want to see them killed," she said.

The request was referred to the city street and alley committee, which will make a recommendation to the full council.

## Ag department approves lease request for C&S sites

SPRINGFIELD—The Illinois Department of Agriculture on Wednesday approved a request by consolidated Grain and Barge Co. to expand operations into three sites formerly operated by C & S Grain, according to director Becky Doyle.

Consolidated has leased facilities in Alvin, Henning and East Lynn from the First Midwest Bank in Danville. The bank foreclosed on the facilities when C & S Grain failed to meet the deadline for reorganizing under federal bankruptcy laws.

Consolidated operates commercial grain facilities in 16 Illinois counties, including one in Bis-

marck, a few miles south of the newly-leased Alvin facility.

Part of the former C & S Grain facility in Wellington was leased earlier this year by Goodwine Cooperative Grain Company in Goodwine.

Adding the three sites will expand Consolidated's capacity by 1,763,000 bushels.

Consolidated is headquartered in curran, near Springfield.

C & S lost its grain warehouse license and state grain dealer's license when it failed to meet state requirements last year.
