## Bodies of missing woman, teen found in rural area

The bodies of a missing Potomac woman and a male teen were found Saturday night, more than four months after they disappeared.

The bodies of Colleen K. Baker, 54, of Potomac, and her ward, Jason Scott Smith, 19, were found at approximately 6:30 p.m., north of Danville.

The pair were reported missing June 23.

The bodies were found in a car in a low-lying

area along Bismarck Road, about a quarter mile east of Route 1.

Officials believe the car swerved off the road and crashed, camouflaged by brush.

Autopsies were scheduled yesterday in Bloomington.

The pair were on their way to Danville Area Community College when they disappeared.

## Marching Cornjerkers finish season on positive note
