# Woman to give 'Unpacking from guilt trip' seminar

Guilt.

It's one of those emotions that can make our lives unpleasant.

And often, we feel guilty about things we shouldn't. 👉

Kendra Smiley knows all about that.

The East Lynn woman will be the featured speaker at a seminar sponsored by Covenant Medical Center, United Samaritans Medical Center Hospice and Carle Hospice.

The seminar, and accompanying luncheon, will be held from noon to 2:30 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 9 at the Ramada Inn in Danville. Tickets are \$15 for the general public and \$12.50 for hospice volunteers and senior citizens. The price includes the luncheon.

"Unpacking From a Guilt Trip" will explore "different things that make us feel guilty," Smiley said.

Smiley's talk will focus on what kind of guilt we pack, who packed it, and whether the guilt is valid or not - "is, it "bad" guilt or "good" guilt," she said.

"If I axe-murdered someone who's a total

stranger, who's done nothing to me, that's good guilt," she said. "Bad guilt is when my child wants a \$150 pair of tennis shoes and I say no. No matter if it's good guilt or bad guilt, it's heavy."

The seminar's goal is to "lighten our load so we can enjoy the journey (of life)" Smiley said, admitting that "the process may be tough, but it's well worth it."

Those who learn to deal appropriately with guilt will be able to live a more intentional life, she said, making choices based on what is best for the individual, not guilt.

Her seminar on guilt grew from a request from the female chief executive officer of a company Smiley was working with.

The CEO said her employees, mostly women. felt guilty about working while leaving their children with sitters. "She challenged me to come up with this message," Smiley said.

Smiley, a former school teacher, began her public speaking career approximately 17 years ago, giving presentations "to anybody who'd have me," she said. "It grew from doing freebies. Little




