Major races, issues listed in Vermilion, Iroquois counties

Four races in tomorrow's election pit incumbents of Vermilion County offices against newcomers who hope to unseat them.

In the race for county clerk, incumbent Democrat Lynn Foster is being challenged by Barbara (Galaskis) Young.

Foster, 45, of Danville, has been county clerk since 1990 and is a former Danville Township trustee.

Young, 42, of Danville, is the Republican challenger. She serves as director of the Danville Board of Election Commissioners.

In the treasurer's race, Democrat incumbent Herbert F. Hales, Jr., is being challenged by GOP candidate Sue Stine.

Hales, 50, of Danville, was elected treasurer in 1990.

Stine, 41, of Catlin, has been chief deputy treasurer since 1987 and a clerk in the treasurer's office since 1979.

Two newcomers want to become county regional superintendent of schools.

Jim Trask, 47, of Oakwood, a Republican, is currently assistant regional school superintendent.

His Democratic challenger is Maurice Arbuckle, 56, of Fairmont, a teacher at the Danville Correctional Center.

One of the men will replace current superintendent Richard Weller, who did not seek reelection.

In the race for county supervisor of assessments, incumbent Republican Gary W. Hix is being challenged by Democrat Donald R. Crist.

Hix, 46, of Danville, was elected supervisor in 1990.

Crist, 27, of Indianola, is a farmer and real estate agent.

In Iroquois County's hottest race, incumbent sheriff Joseph Mathy, a Democrat, faces off against GOP challenger Bill Willis.

Mathy, 42, lives in rural Clifton in northern Iroquois County. He has been sheriff since October 1981.

Willis, 49, lives in rural Loda. He is a taxidermist and retired Illinois State Police captain.

Also in Iroquois County, voters will be asked whether to support a telephone surcharge for a 9-1-1 system.

Officials have proposed charge of up to \$2 per month per telephone network connection to pay for the system. If passed, the surcharge is expected to raise \$288,000 annually on 12,000 customers.

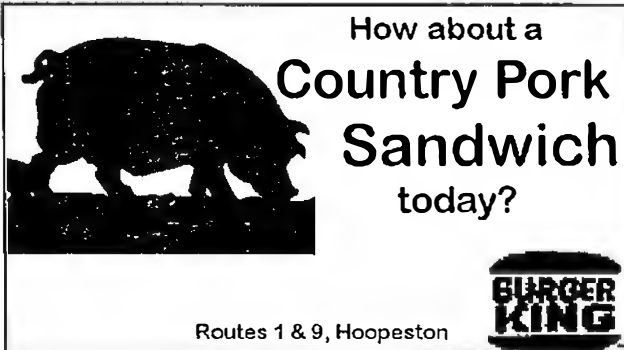
