



Incumbent Hales ousted as Vermilion County treasurer

Vermilion County will have a new treasurer following Tuesday's election.

GOP challenger Sue Stine was declared the winner shortly after 9 p.m., defeating Democrat incumbent Herb Hales, Jr., who was elected in

Stine's victory was declared with the results of 36 of Danville's 44 precincts.

Hales' re-election bid came under a cloud following an investigation into the disappearance of \$200,000 of Danville police and fire pension funds.

Hales maintained his innocence, and, in a July press conference, said the FBI had cleared him of any wrongdoing.

Hales said the money was loaned to Murdock Mining Co., of which he is principal investor. The money was to be used to purchase the Zeigler Mine in Newton.

Hales said Ronald J. Viemont, pension fund manager, made the loans. Viemont's financial consulting license has since been revoked.

In other county races, at press time, incumbent Democrat Lynn Foster was leading Republican challenger Barbara Galaskis Young in the race for Vermilion County Clerk.

In the race for regional superintendent of schools, Republican Jim Trask defeated challenger Maurice Arbuckle.

Trask served as assistant superintendent under Richard Weller who opted not to seek re-election.

In Iroquois County, a hotly-contested race between Democrat incumbent sheriff Joseph Mathy and GOP challenger Bill Willis was decided in Mathy's favor.

Mathy garnered 54 percent of the vote to Willis' 46 percent.

In uncontested races, County Clerk John Kuntz was re-elected, and David Perzee was elected treasurer.

In District 5 for the Iroquois County Board. covering the Milford area, winners were John Wilkening, with 1.875 votes; Edward Schultz with 1,642; and Marjorie Luke with 1,816.

A proposition to fund an enhanced 9-1-1 system in the county passed, 65 percent to 35 percent.

The plan could add up to \$2 to telephone subscribers' monthly bills, raising approximately \$288,000 for the emergency service.




