FMC to sell sprayer product line, 35 workers affected

Approximately 35 workers will be affected by a local company's decision to sell one of its product lines.

FMC announced Monday that it will sell its Hoopeston-based sprayer product line to Durand-Wayland, a LaGrange, Ga.-based manufacturer of orchard sprayers.

The line includes sprayers for orchards, row crops and other industrial applications, as well as a line of municipal sewer cleaning equipment.

Details of the transaction, expected to be completed by mid-December, were not disclosed.

According to a press release from FMC's Chicago headquarters, 35 employees in sales and manufacturing will be affected by the sale. Some workers are expected to join Durand-Wayland and others will remain at FMC.

Salaried employees who do not receive offers

from Durand-Wayland or remain with FMC will receive severance packages, outplacement assistance and counseling.

The company did not divulge how many employees would lose their jobs. Neither Rob McIntosh, Hoopeston plant manager, or John Echols, of the Chicago office, could be reached at press time.

According to the press release, the decision to sell the sprayer line was made to keep the company in a position for future growth in the marketplace.

This is the second Hoopeston-based product line to be sold this year. The palletizer division was sold earlier in 1994.

The Hoopeston plant's 200 employees will continue to manufacture harvesters and other contract-manufactured equipment.

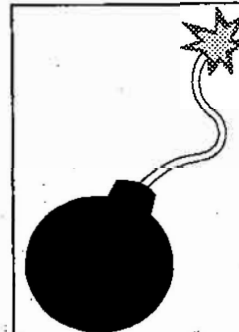


