Mark Drollinger to represent Ward 1 on city council

Hoopeston native Mark Drollinger was named Tuesday night to fill a Ward 1 alderman vacancy.

He replaces Wes Dazey, who died Oct. 25.

Drollinger said he was honored to take Dazey's place, but admitted it would be a challenge.

"I kind of feel like the guy who replaced Lou Gehrig," he said. "Everybody remembers Lou Gehrig, but nobody remembers who followed him. I hope I can bring the same dedication to the job that Wes did."

Drollinger will serve as chairman of the city's street and alley committee, and a member of the ambulance and civic committees, said Mayor Bob Ault.

The new alderman plans to meet with ward residents on a regular basis "to get their feedback on

anything and everything," he said. "I'd like to find out their general feelings and concerns."

Another area of interest is the city's fiscal status. "I'm excited about the new budget," he said. "I want to get my feet wet with that."

This is not Drollinger's first venture in politics. In 1992, he ran against Dazey, losing by only 11 votes.

Drollinger will try to retain his aldermanic seat in the April election. If successful, he will again face re-election in 1997.

Drollinger and his wife, Julie, have two children Christopher, 6 and Patrick, almost two

Hoopeston city officials ink ten-year cable contract

Hoopeston residents will continue to have cable service provided by Hoopeston Cable TV.

The city council Tuesday night approved a 10-year, non-exclusive franchise with the company, part of Omega Communications of Indianapolis.

The franchise agreement, similar to one expiring at the end of this year, gives the city three percent of gross receipts as a franchise fee, which, according to Mayor Bob Ault, adds approximately \$27,000 to city coffers annually.

Alderman Bill Goodwine questioned the three percent figure, saying if the city could get more under Federal Communications Commission laws, it should.

However, other officials said the increase would be passed on to the consumer. "We're really asking the people of Hoopeston to pay more for cable (with an increased rate)," said alderman John Haughee.

The agreement becomes effective Jan. 1, 1995. In other business, the council:

passed a \$400,446 tax levy, down approximately \$30,000 from last year. Goodwine, chairman of the city finance committee, said much of the decrease was caused because the Hoopeston Public Library formed a library district and is levying its own taxes.






