

Farmers see end result of harvest at Farm Appreciation Day

American farmers feed the world, but for a group of local farmers, the tables were turned Tuesday.

Area farmers were invited to the annual Farmer Appreciation Day sponsored by the Hoopeston Rotary Club.

And after eating a lunch catered by Price Less Foods, farmers got a chance to hear and see where their product goes when it leaves the farm.

Will Duenseng, technical services manager for Lauhoff in Danville, explained how corn is milled to take corn to the marketplace.

The Danville Lauhoff facility, which opened in 1942, focuses primarily on dry corn milling. Duenseng said. In 1953, soybean processing was added.

Snow routes


Residents are reminded that snow routes are in effect when total snowfall is three inches or more, said Dave Knake, city street and alley superintendent.

Police chief lists areas where city snowmobiling allowed

Last week's snows have brought out a new traffic concern for both motorists and police: snowmobiles.

Unlike cars and trucks, however, these winter vehicles are allowed only in certain areas of town. said police chief Orval Kaag.

By city ordinance, snowmobiling is allowed only in certain areas of Hoopeston, including: any alley; on Thompson Ave., from the east to west corporate boundary; Market St., from Market and Thompson to the northern corporate boundary; Sixth Ave., between Thompson and Orange; West Chestnut between Sixth Ave. and First Ave.: East Chestnut between Market and Euclid; Euclid

from Orange to Penn: Penn form Euclid to Eighth St.; Eighth St. from Penn to Main; Main from Eighth St. to Seventh St.; Sevent St. from Main to the northern city boundary.

Snowmobiling on other streets is allowed if the crossing is made at an ange approximately 90 degrees to the direction of the street and at a place where no obstruction prevents a wuick and safe crossing; the snowmobile is completely stopped before crossing the street; and the operator yields the right of way to all on-coming traffic constituting a hazard.

Snowmobiles are banned on any Hoopeston Area school district property.
