Hoopeston Area board discusses garage, buses

A long-discussed project will finally become reality for the Hoopeston Area school district.

At Thursday's board meeting, Supt. Don Dean said the district plans to build a bus garage during the summer months.

Dean estimated the project at \$120,000 and said money will come from the working cash fund, which will be repaid over a five-year period. "Basically, we're borrowing funds from ourselves," he said.

The planned structure will have 10 bays for buses and two additional ones for storage. Dean said the unheated garage will have a concrete floor, floor drains and electronic doors.

The garage is "something that has been bandied about for a long time," Dean said. "I think '95 is going to be the magic year."

In related business, Dean said the district will seek bids on two buses, expected to cost approximately \$90,000.

Dean and transportation superintendent Darrell Brown hope to get bus purchases on a five-year rotation, "If we can get on that, we should have some pretty good buses," Dean said. "We've been on a 'buy one and keep it 10 years' schedule."

In unrelated business, the board:

- learned rains last year damaged the northern corner of the Maple School gym floor, which was unnoticed until recently. Insurance will pay for a new gym floor, as well as refinishing. Dean said.
- heard that equipment for the distance learning program is being installed. The program will connect Hoopeston Area High School with Danville Area Community College and other high schools in the college district.
- ♦ learned the district will get \$9.60 in impact funds from the Rankin reorganization. Dean said he made lengthy calls to Springfield and Washington, D.C. to get that information. "I'm going to be waiting for the phone bill," he said.


