Six candidates, seven seats open on library board

Six people have filed for seven seats on the Hoopeston Public Library board of directors.

Candidates, in order of appearance on the ballot, include Sharilyn (Sherry) Miller, Mark Conolly, Dale Fry, Lawrence Jahn, Janet Crouch and Don Sherrill, said head librarian Lou Graham.

A seventh member will be selected by the board after the April 4 election, she said.

Since this is the first election of directors since the facility went from a city library to a library district, board members will draw lots after the election for their length of term. Two of the seven will serve two years; two, four years; and three, six years, Graham said.

Two current members, Sally Keith and Tim Drollinger, did not seek election. The ninth member, Gary Webb, moved from the district.

Voters will be asked not only to vote for library district representatives, but also will be asked whether the district should expand.

The ballot will ask voters whether the district should grow to include the entire Hoopeston Area and Rossville-Alvin school districts.

Currently, the district covers only the city of Hoopeston.

The issue will be on ballots in Hoopeston, Rossville, Wellington, Rankin, Alvin, East Lynn and Cheneyville.

If that issue passes, the estimated corporate tax rate will be 15 cents per \$100 assessed valuation, with a maintenance rate of two cents per \$100 assessed valuation. Owners of a \$30,000 residential property would pay an estimated \$17 for library services, compared with the current fee of \$35 for out-of-district borrower's cards.
