## National Microsystems, Inc. files bankruptcy

National Microsystems of Illinois has closed its doors, leaving unpaid a \$300,000 loan made to the company by the city of Hoopeston.

The company, which filed for protection under Chapter 11 reorganization in 1993, changed the status to Chapter 7 bankruptcy at a hearing last Thursday, according to bankruptcy trustee Steve Miller.

Microsystems listed assets including its Hoopeston factory, a "relatively insignificant amount of inventory," some accounts receivable, some work in progress and some equipment. Miller said.

All assets appear to be listed as collateral for secured loans, Miller said. Major creditors include Palmer American National Bank of Danville and Illini Community Development Corp. of Newman.

Miller said Palmer American National has a first mortgage on the building and interest in the company's machinery.

With the building and inventory accounted for, there are no assets to pay unsecured claims, such as the city's investment, Miller said.

Because the loan was made as shares of stock. the city will probably not recoup its loss, Miller said. "Creditors will be paid before shareholders," he said. "It would appear that the stock would be worthless."

The Hoopeston city council unanimously voted to invest \$300,000 of state surtax funds when Microsystems opened in 1991, said Mayor Bob Ault.

Under terms of the agreement, the city became a shareholder with Ault representing the city on the company's board of directors.


The money was to be repaid beginning three years after the company opened. Microsystems was to pay \$5,000 monthly for five years, Ault See BANKRUPTCY on other side
