

OSHA cites, fines Demeter after fatal accident

Demeter, Inc. may have to pay \$27,000 in fines for violations in connection with the Nov. 30 death of an employee at the Hoopeston facility.

The Occupational Safety and Hazard Administration (OSHA) cited the company for serious violations following an investigation of safety conditions at the local elevator.

Fines and alleged violations include:

•\$7,000 for allowing three employees to enter a grain bin on Nov. 30 without body harnesses and lifelines.

One of the employees, Ivan D. Wise, 34, of Stockland, died when he fell into a partially-full bin that he was cleaning.

County coroner Lyle Irvin said Wise died of positional asphyxia, caused by the weight of grain on his chest.

•\$4,000 for allegedly not providing annual training for employees. The company is also to provide training when changes in employees' jobs would expose them to new hazards.

•\$7,000 for failing to certify on a bin entry per-

mit that electricity to unloading devices in the bin had been locked out.

- •\$2,000 for allegedly failing to test the oxygen content of air inside the bin before allowing workers inside.
- •\$7,000 for allegedly not having an observer outside the bin.
- •a violation, but no fine, for allegedly allowing employees to enter the bin without stopping machinery that posed a danger to employees.

Demeter, Inc. has three options: pay the fines, contest them in a letter to the U.S. Dept. of Labor, or request an informal converence with local OSHA officials.

According to OSHA records, some violations had been corrected. Others were due to be corrected by Monday. Still others must be remedied by Feb. 7.

Calls to the local office were referred to vice president Ken Klemme at the central office in Fowler, Ind.

Klemme had not returned calls as of presstime.


