

Library, Demeter to host grain market program

Knowing when to hold 'em and when to fold 'em is a concept that applies to more than playing cards.

For farmers, knowing when to hold their grain and when to sell it is an important part of economic survival.

To help make that decision, the Hoopeston Public Library and Demeter, Inc., are sponsoring a program called "Grain Markets - What to Do."

The program will be at 2 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 23 at the library meeting room.

The featured speaker will be Darrel Good, professor and extension economist in the University of Illinois Department of Ag Economics. Good's responsibilities there include the area of agricultural price forecasting.

"I was told by a farmer that Darrel Good is a

respectable person to listen to in this area," said head librarian Lou Graham.

Graham said she saw a need for such a program. Knowing whether to pay storage prices or sell is "one of the hardest things to do in farming," she said. "I'm a farm wife so I speak from experience."

The program will, in a sense, be a first for Good. "He said he'd never given a talk at a library before," Graham said. "Once again, we're on the cutting edge," she said, laughing.

Good's presentation will include handouts to those attending, she said.

The program is almost new ground for the library, as well. "We've never done a lot of adult programs," Graham said. "We hope to do more of this in the future.


