


# Hoopeston Area board buys buses, rehires principals

The Hoopeston Area school district will spend nearly \$100,000 on new buses.

The school board Thursday night approved purchasing two buses from Midwest Transit Equipment, Inc., of Kankakee. Each bus will cost \$48.628.

However, the district will get back more than \$18,000 in July when the bus company purchases two 1988 buses now owned by the district.

In unrelated action, the board rehired administrative personnel, including Mark Conolly, high school principal; John Burkey, junior high principal; Larry Hill, John Greer/Honeywell principal; Maureen Spisok, Maple principal; Ron Lewis, building/grounds director; and Darrell Brown,

transportation director.

In other business, the board:

\*hired Russell Leigh & Associates for the annual audit. The basic audit price increased approximately \$300, to about \$3,900. Costs for three special audits, on low-income families, Chapter I money and the summer and regular migrant programs, increased from \$200 to \$225 each

\*learned construction on the Maple Grade School addition is almost completed. Construction on the \$1.8 million addition began last April.

\*learned the school will receive a quality review from the state in July. The program measures school improvement in several areas.

# Hoopeston housing rehab grant not approved by state

More than \$330,000 requested by Hoopeston officials for housing rehabilitation will not be coming this year.

Hoopeston was not selected to receive a Department of Commerce and Community Affairs (DCCA) grant, said Scott Rose.

Rose, housing program manager for the Champaign County Regional Planning Commission, assisted city officials in applying for funding.

Rose said the city's request was probably denied because of the number of applications submitted last year.

Almost 60 communities requested more than \$15 million for a program with a \$7 million budget, he said. "There's a far greater demand for those program dollars than is available," Rose said.

While Hoopeston was not funded, Milford got the green light on its application, though at a reduced rate.

The village received \$166,000, approximately 35 percent less than requested, said Rose, who also assisted Milford officials.

That money will be used to revamp 12 to 15 homes.

Another area community, Watseka, in the program the past two years, was not funded this year.


Rose has asked DCCA officials for input on making Hoopeston's application more appealing in hopes that the city council will approve reapplying.

"This year, we just had a lot of surprises," Rose said. "Things I didn't expect to happen, happened.


