The group, with a red, white and blue motif, performed a medley incorporating "Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy," and "The Morning After," "One Tin Soldier," and "Do A Little Something."

Following morning competition, the group performed as an exhibition act before finals on Saturday evening.

New Direction has 44 members, 10 crew members and 10 combo members. The group is directed by Marty Lindvahl and choreographed by Michael Weaver of Chicago.

Next weekend, both the junior and senior high show choirs will compete in Pekin.

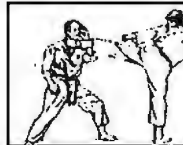
