

Rossville trustees OK radiator waste dumping

ROSSVILLE—A radiator repair shop is expected to get the green light to dispose of waste in the Rossville sewer treatment plant.

Gary Kinnett, owner of Kinnett's Radiator and Welding Service of rural Rossville, on Monday night requested that he be allowed to dump neutralized waste in the treatment plant every three months.

Under a proposal Kinnett submitted, he will pay the village \$15 per 500 gallons of waste.

Kinnett told trustees that chemicals meet both state and federal Environmental Protection Agency guidelines for direct dumping.

Trustces approved the plan, but will have it checked by the village attorney. Also, if EPA reg-

Hoopeston liquor establishment expands packaged sale area

You might say Sam Browne is pumped about the addition to his business.

Browne, owner of BJ's Pump on Route 1, recently completed a 2,000 square foot addition to the existing building.

The addition includes 900 square feet of show room space for expanded packaged liquor sales.

The decision to expand came, in part, because of location. "I thought we were in a good location, being on the highway," Browne said. "I just wanted to try to expand a little bit, but I didn't want to go with a dance floor."

Since Browne already had a license to sell packaged liquor, the decision was a natural one. In fact, BJ's was already selling packaged liquor, "but we didn't do it to full advantage," he said. Browne credits manager Tammy Alkire as beulations change, Kinnett will stop dumping. In other action, trustees:

—approved spending \$1,756 on monthly water testing by the state EPA. The village will sign a three-year contract.

—will accept sealed bids on the 10-year-old computer formerly used by the police department. If no bids are received, the computer will be donated to the village ambulance service.

—set an appropriations meeting for 1 p.m. March 11.

—approved spending \$5,227 for a cement saw, used compressor and new jackhammer. The costs will be shared between the village street/alley and gas departments.


