



HAHS show choir, jazz bands have busy weekend

The Hoopeston Area High School jazz bands will participate in the Herscher High School Jazz Festival Saturday in Herscher.

Jazz Band II will perform at 8:40 a.m., followed by Jazz Band I at 9:20 a.m.

The junior high and high school show choirs will also compete this weekend, at the Watseka Show Choir Invitational at the Watseka High School gym.

Junior high competition begins at 7 p.m. Friday. The "Cornjerker Connection" will perform at 9:05 p.m., competing against five other junior high show choirs.

The high school competition begins at 8 a.m. Saturday. "New Direction" is scheduled to perform at 4:45 p.m., one of 23 high school show choirs.

Finals will be held beginning at 7:30 p.m. Saturday with the top six show choirs from the day

competition performing.

Both the show choir and jazz bands will perform locally on Tuesday, during the Hoopeston Area Junior High and High School Jazz Band and Show Choir Concert. The event begins at 7 p.m. in the junior high gym.

The Hoopeston Area Junior High show choir, Cornjerker Connection, tied for second place with Sullivan at the Pekin Show Choir Inviational Feb. 25. Mt. Zion was the first place winner.

In high school competition, HA's New Direction came home as fifth runner up to grand champion Mt. Zion.

This was the first time the high school placed among the six finalists at the competition.

Lincoln Trails rep to answer questions on library grant

Barb Cressman, a Lincoln Trail Libraries System representative, will be at the Hoopeston Public Library from noon to 2 p.m. Saturday.

Cressman will answer questions about the library system and the regional demonstration grant the library has participated in since April 1994.

The grant allows residents of the Hoopeston Area and Rossville Alvin school districts to use the library without charge until April 30.

On April 4, registered voters in both districts will decide whether the library district will expand to include both districts.

Currently, only Grant Township residents pay library taxes and use the facility for free. Those outside the township, including Hoopeston Area school district residents in Wellington, East Lynn, Rankin and Cheneyvill, must pay to use the library.

If the annexation referendum fails, those residents outside Grant Township would be charged \$35 for a borrower's card.

If the district expansion is approved, the estimated tax rates will be 15 cents per \$100 assessed valuation with a maintenance tax rate of two cents per \$100 assessed valuation.


