## Residents pack city hall for anti-crime program

Residents want to take their streets, their community, back from the bad guys.

Approximately 60 people attended a Neighborhood Watch meeting Wednesday night to learn how to do just that.

The meeting, sponsored by the Hoopeston Police Department, featured Deputy Rick Barnes from the Vermilion County Sheriff's Department.

Barnes, the department's state-certified crime prevention officer, explained the program to citizens. "It's just watching after each other," he said.

Barnes said a Neighborhood Watch program will not stop crime. "No matter what you do, you're not going to prevent it," he said. "There is no crime prevention, only crime displacement."

Barnes and Hoopeston police chief Orval Kaag will work together to divide the city into districts

for the program.

Two people, Truman Page and Earl Drollinger, volunteered to coordinate the program and find captains from districts in the city.

Captains will canvass neighborhoods to get at least 50 percent of residents participating in the watch.

The group will not be vigilantes, but will "be our eyes and ears," Barnes said.

In the process, residents will get to know their neighbors and regain a sense of community, he said.

The fight to take the streets back will not be easy, Barnes said. "It's going to be a hard battle to get them back." he said.

The group's next meeting will be March 27, followed by meetings the fourth Monday of each month.
