

# Library to host tornado preparedness seminar

The Hoopeston Public Library and WILL AM meteorologist Ed Kieser will present a Tornado Preparedness seminar at 7 p.m. March 28 in the library meeting room.

The session is free and open to the public.

"Generally, last year was a quiet year for tornadoes, but it only takes one storm to cause devastating damage," Kieser said. "Unfortunately, there was a fatal tornado in our listening area last April."

Shortly after midnight on April 27, 1994, a tornado struck West Lafavette and Lafavette. Ind., killing two people and injuring several.

"The odds of surviving a tornado are at least 99 percent - if you follow proper safety procedures. Kieser said. "So, especially in this part of the country, it's very important to educate people about the dangers of tornadoes and the precautions people can take. That's why we're offering this session as a community service."

Kieser will also talk about how tornadoes form and how they are forecast. He will show a video of tornadoes and answer audience questions.

"I'll be dispelling some tornado myths and talking about where and when tornadoes are most likely to strike," he said.

Kicser, downstate Illinois' only full-time radio meteorologist, has presented tornado preparedness seminars in Illinois and Indiana for the past four years.

He received his bachclor's and master's degrees in meteorology from Penn State University and has been WILL AM's meteorologist for eight vears.

## Council discusses complaints of loud, mobile music

Hoopeston police are being asked to crack down on lovers of loud music.

At Tuesday's council meeting, alderman Mike Eckersley said he received complaints from residents about cars playing music "loud enough to rattle the windows."

Eckersley said those complaining have nothing against music, but do object to the volume. "They don't want to deny kinds any of their rights to listen to their music," he said.

The alderman suggested that motorists with loud music be warned once, then ticketed for subsequent offenses.

Police chief Orval Kaag responded that officers already cite motorists for disturbing the peace

when they are found to play music too loudly. In other action Tuesday, the council:

—will seek bids for perpetual care urns at Floral Hill Cemetery. Also, the cemetery pond is being renovated. A spray fountain is expected to be added before Memorial Day activities.


-learned 50 trees are available to residents on a first come, first served basis. Residents interested in having a tree planted on their property should contact city hall.
