Meteorologist offers tornado tips at seminar

April showers, just around the corner, bring thunderstorms and, occasionally, tornadoes.

Surviving the storms was the topic of a seminar Tuesday at the Hoopeston Public Library. Approximately 30 people listened to Ed Kieser, WILL-AM meteorologist, discuss what tornadoes are and how to live through them.

"I think if you live in this part of the country, it's definitely important to know what to do because you never know when it's going to happen," Kieser said.

Illinois and Indiana, not in what is considered Tornado Alley, are, in fact, in a side alley, he said.

Twisters are divided into five categories, weak, strong and violent.

Two-thirds of all tornadoes are in the weakest categories. Only two percent are violent, but these cause two thirds of all tornado-related deaths, he said.

Most tornadoes occur in May, although most violent storms are in April. And, Kieser said, most tornadoes strike between 2 and 6 p.m.

The worst place to be during a tornado is a mobile home. "Mobile homes are never safe," he said. "You're better off in a ditch,"

Also, residents should not take time to open windows before seeking shelter. That's an old wives' tale," he said. "That's what used to be preached in the 60s."

Another misconception is seeking shelter in the southwest corner of a room. "That's where most of the walls collapse," he said.

Tornado survival guidelines

Go to the lowest level of a house.

Get under something sturdy and cover yourself with a blanket, pillows or cushions.

Stay away from windows.

Abandon mobile homes and cars.

If outdoors, lie flat and cover your head with your hands.

In large buildings, avoid open rooms. Go to a designated area, if available.

Ag department announces commodity board elections

SPRINGFIELD—The Illinois Department of Agriculture is accepting petitions from people seeking election to farm commodity boards.

The department oversees elections for the Illinois Corn Marketing Board, Illinois Soybean Program Operating Board and the Illinois Sheep and Wool Marketing Board.

To be eligible to serve, candidates must be 18 or older, have produced and marketed the commodity the board represents during the last calen-

dar year, live in the district they would represent and file a complete petition by the specified deadline.

The only local election is for the Illinois Corn Marketing Board. Petitions are due May 15.

Elections will be July 6 at Cooperative Extension Service offices. Winners will begin three-year terms Aug. I.




