Heavy turnout predicted for municipal election

A heavy turnout is expected for today's election in Hoopeston.

One reason for the predicted high turnout is the landfill advisory referendum appearing on today's ballot.

The referendum asks whether the city council should grant a 120-acre expansion for the Illinois Landfills, Inc. site in Hoopeston.

Because the referendum is an advisory one, the results are not binding on the council.






