

Familiar face returns to Rossville village board

A former Rossville village trustee has been appointed to the board for two years.

Tom Mills was appointed to serve the remaining two years of former trustee Ron Rife's term. Rife resigned April I because he moved from the village.

Mills. re-elected trustees Richard Kiser and Charles Cornell, and newly-elected trustee Jon Witvoet were sworn in at a special board meeting Monday night.

Mills is tentatively slated to head the village's

water/sewer committee, said Mayor Mery Smith, adding Mills' experience will serve the village well. "He's a go-getter," Smith said, adding Mills will work to get grants for revamping the village sewer treatment plant.

Mills said he is glad to be on the board. "I'm especially pleased since the mayor and several trustees came and asked me to do this," he said.

Mills will not seek re-election in two years. "If I can't get these projects done in two years, well, there's no point in fighting it," he said.

Local library referendum one of few to pass in state

The referendum expanding the Hoopeston Public Library district was one of only a handful to pass in last Tuesday's election, according to librarian Lou Graham.

Of 43 library districts statewide trying to expand their boundaries, only 13 were successful or partially successful. Graham said at Monday's Community Involvement Committee meeting.

"It was not a good year for libraries," Graham said. "The heartbreaker was Watseka where it was defeated by one vote."

Graham said the expanded district will benefit not only the library, but the entire town. "It's a win/win situation, no matter how you look at it." she said. "It's going to bring more people to Hoopeston."

Graham said the expansion will approximately double the amount the library receives in a state per-capita grant.

The grant is based on the population of the entire district.


