Hoopeston recycling business has new owner, new name

A local recycling business has a new owner and a new name.

Dave Borders recently purchased the former GW Recycling Center located in Wellington, and has changed the company's name to Borders Recycling.

The name and owner may have changed, but the business still accepts ferrous and non-ferrous metals, Borders said.

Accepted metals include copper, brass and aluminum, including siding. Batteries and radiators are also accepted, as well as screen doors without windows or screens and stainless steel.

Borders assumed the business March 11, in part, he said, to make up for income lost in other ventures.

"My businesses had gotten slow," he said, referring to Hoopeston Taxi Service and AWP An-

swering Service, both affected by local factory downsizing and planned closings.

"I was looking around for something to buy," Borders said. "It's not a business that's going to make you rich, but it supplements the income I lost from the other things."

Borders already has plans to expand to other recyclable materials, including paper, glass and plastic. Those additions will come slowly, however. "I'm taking things one step at a time," he said, adding he must first find companies to accept the recycled materials. "I want to have a clean recycling place, not a junkyard."

In his short time recycling, Borders has learned on important thing: people recycle, especially pop and beer cans. "Man, there's a lot of them," he said, crediting rising aluminum prices. "Prices

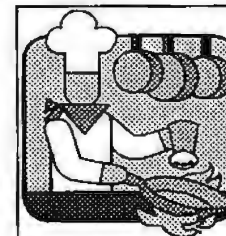
