

Woman gets European trip as 40th birthday gift

If turning 40 was angst-inducing for Betty Richards, the gift she received marking the milestone was even more of a shock.

Richards, secretary to Hoopeston Area school superintendent Don Dean, celebrated her 40th birthday March 28.

On April 4, she was guest of honor at a surprise birthday party hosted by district employees and the board of education.

After being served cake and punch, Richards opened her gift: a box wrapped in aluminum foil. Inside the box was another box, also wrapped in aluminum foil. Inside, Richards found yet another foil-wrapped box.

Inside that was a small box, wrapped in birthday paper. Tucked inside was a poster for a European vacation, a trip Richards will take in July.

"I didn't know anything about it," said Richards, who admitted thinking she knew every-

thing that went on in the district. "I was very. very, very surprised and very appreciative."

Richards, along with teachers Rita Tolch and Cindy Masengale, their daughters, and four honors English students, leave July 4 for a nine-day trip to London, Paris, Lucerne, Innsbruck and Munich

While traveling, the group will see the Tower Bridge, St. Paul's Cathedral and Buckingham Palace in London; the Arc de Triomphe, Eiffel Tower, Cathedral of Notre Dame in France and the Castle of Neuschwanstein - the basis for Disnevland - in Germany.

When you have a conversation with a friend over the telephone, you cer- Law tainly expect privacy. When you talk to Matters your doctor, you probably believe that no one can ever find out what you told her.

Despite your confidence that your words may be secret, they may indeed legally become quite public.

Take, for example, your telephone calls. Many

people do not know that cordless telephone calls can be listened to by any standard programmable scanner because cordless telephones operate on public frequencies.

Calls you wish to keep secret should not be made on a cordless phone. Calls made from your regular phone are still safe.

It is also important to note that your cellular phone calls may be listened to by scanners, as well: however, that is illegal since cellular phones operate on private frequencies.

You should keep in mind, however, that almost everything you tell your doctor will go into your records. If you are ever injured and file a personal injury or work comp claim, your prior medical records may become public knowledge and be thoroughly analyzed in open court.

There are other types of cases where medical records become relevant and are exposed in court, as well.


