# Musical production leads students to fund drive

# 'Oklahoma' spurs Hoopeston Area students to help victims

On March 31 and April 1, local residents were asked to watch the Hoopeston Area drama department perform "Oklahoma".

Now Hoopeston Area students are asking for help in aiding Oklahoma City residents and volunteers.

Students have started a collection to send money to Oklahoma City, said Rita Tolch, Hoopeston Area drama teacher. "If nothing else, we want to help feed all the volunteers who are there," she said.

Students will conduct a streetcorner collection from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday in Hoopeston and are requesting donations from area businesses and churches, Tolch said.

Donations will also be accepted through the mail and should be sent to: Oklahoma, HAHS Superintendents Office, 615 E. Orange, Hoopeston, IL, 60942.

The fund drive will end May 5.

It was the musical "Oklahoma" which got students interested, Tolch said.

"(The bombing) gave Oklahoma a whole new meaning," she said. "You sit and watch and there's nothing you can do. You want to do something.

. "I know when you can't do anything, moral support is the best thing you can give. This is moral support and financial support."

Students have not set a goal for their efforts, Tolch said. "When you start out, you think \$500 would be nice, but then you want to get all you can."

# Rural Alvin man killed in car-train accident Saturday

A rural Alvin man was killed Saturday afternoon after his car collided with a freight train north of Alvin.

Travis. A. Sutton, 32, was pronounced dead at 4:05 p.m. at United Samaritans Medical Center in Danville, due to massive head and internal injuries.

According to reports, Mr. Sutton was eastbound at County Road 3330 North at about 3 p.m. Saturday when he collided with a northbound train.

Officials said Mr. Sutton was crossing the northern set of two sets of tracks in the area.

The southern set has working flashing lights to signal approaching trains, but while the northern

set has lights, they reportedly were not functional.

Mr. Sutton is survived by his wife, Lois; three daughters, Hannah Marie, Hayley Ann and Mara Lynn; his parents, George and Jo Lynn Thornsbrough Sutton; and a sister, Rhonda Atchie of Alvin.

Funeral services will be at 11 a.m. Tuesday at the Alvin Church of Christ.

Burial will be in Gundy Cemetery west of Bismarck.

Visitation was held Monday night at the Morrison Funeral Home in Bismarck.
