Car dealership changes hands after nearly 50 years

Burton Motors has a new name and new owner today.

Ronald King, 35, of Bourbonnais, will become the official owner at 3:30 p.m. Wednesday.

King will change the name to Ron King Motors, Inc., said Bruce Burton, whose family has owned the business for 49 years.

"He's going to do a lot of exciting things," Burton said. Plans include remodeling the building and updating service equipment.

Burton said King may add more employees to the seven-member staff. "It will be the same friendly people," Burton said. "There will be a few additions and no subtractions."

Burton decided to sell for personal reasons. "It's time for a change," he said. "I do this with tremendously mixed emotions."

Burton's grandfather started the business in 1946, passing it to his son, who, in turn, passed it to Burton.

King and Burton talked about a potential sale for over a year before the actual deal was made.

King wanted a dealership in a small town because he likes small town living. He plans to move to Hoopeston, Burton added.

What Burton, and his wife, Emily, will do has not been decided.

"I really don't have anything in stone," Burton said, adding he will take some time off before starting a new venture. "I've got to clear my head out after all this."

Ron King Motors will be closed until May 1. Sales hours at the business will be 9 a.m.-8 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 9 a.m.-6 p.m. Friday and 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Saturday.

Service hours will be 7:30 a.m.-6 p.m. Monday through Friday and 8 a.m.-noon Saturday.

The sale says something about Hoopeston, Burton said. King's acquisition "is indicative of his faith in the community," he said.

Acting city attorney resigns from post effective in May

Calvin Hultquist, acting city attorney for the past two years, announced Tuesday he will resign from that position.

The decision was made because of the growth of Hultquist's practice. City business made it "difficult to devote enough time to my clients," he said. "It will be nice to have my schedule cleared so I can do what I enjoy most - going to court."

Hultquist said that while he enjoyed acting as city attorney, the position also had drawbacks. "For example," he said, "you must always be neutral and cannot speak your mind on issues affect-

ing the city....Being very opinionated, it was sometimes torture not being able to express my opinions."

Hultquist, who was appointed acting city attorney while an associate at Manion, Devens & McPetridge, started his own practice last year. While he continued to act as city attorney, Manion's firm was lead counsel for the municipality.

Although he will be out of city business, Hultquist plans to take an active interest in what happens in Hoopeston.
