Hoopeston woman, Onarga man nabbed in drug bust

DANVILLE—A Hoopeston woman and an Onarga man were arrested Wednesday on drug charges.

Nora E. Palomo, 37, of 406 E. Main, and Isidro Perez Melgoza, 32, 108 Walnut, Onarga, were arrested at Palomo's home on charges of possession with intent to deliver over 500 grams of cannabis.

The pair was arrested by the Vermilion County Metropolitan Enforcement Group (VMEG) in conjunction with U.S. Postal authorities. Police seized approximately 1,381 grams of cannabis, with a street value of over \$10,000, according to a VMEG press release. The cannabis had allegedly been mailed from Texas.

Also sezied was a loaded handgun and a vehicle valued at \$4,000.

The two could face three to seven years in jail and up to a \$25,000 fine for the Class 2 felony.

The Hoopeston Police Department assisted with the investigation.

This is the 12th year the wards have been given.




