## VMEG arrests Rossville man on cocaine charge

A rural Rossville man was arrested Tuesday on federal drug charges.

Charles T. Allison, 43, route 1, Rossville, was charged with attempt to possess cocaine with intent to distribute.

According to a press release from the Vermilion County Metropolitan Enforcement Group (VMEG), Allison was arrested after law enforcement personnel searched his home.

Drug agents seized 458 grams of cocaine, with a street value of more than \$137,000. A vehicle was also seized.

The charge is punishable by up to 30 years in prison and a \$2 million fine or up to life imprisonment with a prior drug conviction.

VMEG worked in conjunction with United States Postal Inspectors and was assisted by the Vermilion County Sheriff's Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration.

false information.

When you have been denied credit on the basis of credit report, the bureau issuing the report must provide you with a copy of your report within 30 days of receipt of your written request. Furthermore, when false or outdated information appears on your report, the bureau must remove it promptly.

Credit bureas are allowed to report bankruptcies for 10 years. They may report other bad debts, judgements, paid tax liens, collection accounts, write-offs and other negative information for seven years. Information regarding criminal cases may also only be reported for seven years.

Finally, beware of "credit repair' businesses. Many are fraudulent and make promises they cannot keep. Your attorney can advise you regarding repairing your credit and assist you effectively.
