## Casey's plans to open second Hoopeston store next year

A third convenience store is expected to open in Hoopeston next year.

Mayor Bob Ault confirmed Thursday that Casey's General Stores plans to build a second Hoopeston facility, probably by next spring.

The new store is planned for the corner of Route 1 and Penn Street, next to Terminex International, Ault said.

The company is considering purchasing a vacant lot, said Casey's representative Christy Malone.

Ault said company officials believe "there's a

need for this."

Unlike the existing Casey's, which has a packaged beer and wine license, the new store will not sell alcohol, Ault said. "There aren't any (liquor licenses) available."

The new store will be treated as a separate entity, Ault said. Any request from the company for a liquor license would need city council approval.

That the company is building a second store "says a lot about our community," Ault said. "I think it's nice that they're coming back, building here, opening a second store."

## Sports conference decision delayed until May 16: AD

Hoopeston Area High School officials must wait until next week to learn if they will be part of the Sangamon Valley athletic conference.

Jim Matta, Hoopeston Area athletic director, said Thursday that the decision hinges on acceptance from the Prairie Central school board.

That board will meet May 15 and present its decision May 16, Matta said.

Local school officials had hoped to hear this week whether the addition was granted.

If Hoopeston Area is approved, the district will join the conference during the 1997-98 school year.

Hoopeston Area has been independent since the Wauseca conference disbanded in the 1989-90 school year, Matta said.

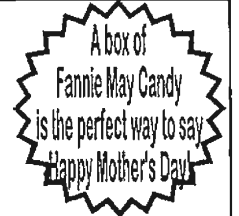

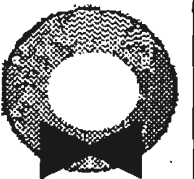
