

Tuesday night's storm left many local residents busy cleaning Wednesday morning.

Nearly three inches of rain fell on Hoopeston Tuesday night. The rain, coupled with high winds and lightening. left many residents sweeping debris.

The city's southeast side was especially hit by strong winds. A tree fell on East Washington and large limbs were reported down in other areas.

Flooding problems were reported on East Mc-Neil, said Mayor Bob Ault, adding street and alley crews were out during the night to block flooded streets. Wednesday morning found workers "cleaning streets as fast as they can get to them." Ault said.

One flood problem was more man-made than the work of Mother Nature.

Ault reported that the gate on the Ninth St. retention basin had been opened by an unidentified person.

The basin was constructed to hold water flowing into Hoopeston from farmland to the north.

Water flowed into the basin 'like an open gate," Ault said, adding that since the basin gate had been tampered with, water flowed out just as quickly. "We lost some of the effectiveness of retention."

A locking gate will be put on the basin to solve the tampering problem, he said.

Front St., an area normally hit hard by flood waters. "doesn't seem to be too bad." Ault said.

The water problem is not expected to ease as rain is in the local forecast for at least the next two days.

Street safety topic of Neighborhood Watch meeting

Street safety and latchkey children were the topics of May's Neighborhood Watch meeting held Monday night.

Rick Barnes. Neighborhood Watch coordinator for the Vermilion County Sheriff's Department, spoke to approximately 10 people at the meeting. Regarding street safety, women arc especially vulnerable. Barnes said, urging women to "walk with confidence."

Barnes urged parents to teach children who are home alone not to answer the door or tell strangers, including delivery people, that parents are not at home.

Barnes also displayed several personal safety items, including pepper spray flashlights and

pens. personal alarms and a cellular phone.


