

Illinois to have zero tolerance for underaged drinkers

At this time of the year, teenagers are making tough decisions that will affect the rest of their

lives. One of the most important decisions concerns drinking and driving. Legally

Effective Jan. 1, 1995, the State of Ilinois will have "zero tolerance" for any driver under 21 who chose to drink and drive. Under the new "Use It & Lose It" legislation, drivers under 21 will lose their driving privileges for a minimum of three months if there is any trace of alcohol in their system. If the driver is convicted of "driving under the influence" (blood alcohol content of .10 or greater), he or she will lose their driving privileges for a minimum of two years

and face possible fines and jail time on the <u>first</u> offense. Further, teenage drivers caught with al-

cohol in their system can expect high insurance costs, mandatory alcohol evaluation, court and attorney fees and negative long term effects on their driving record, job and higher education opportunities.

However, drinking and driving can have even a more serious consequence than a loss of driving privileges. Teenagers can and are losing their lives. Nationally, ever day six individuals between the ages of 16 and 20 die in automobile crashes, almost half of which are alcohol re-
