



Rossville trustees increase water rates to meet expenses

ROSSVILLE—A shortfall in Rossville water rates is causing those rates to be increased.

At Monday's board meeting, trustees approved an increase to \$4.10 per 1.000 gallons.

Trustee Tom Mills, chairman of the village water/sewer committee. said the village generates \$3.06 per 1.000 gallons income from water. but has expenses of \$4.10.

After researching rates in Potomac, Windsor, Westville. Georgetown and Catlin. Mills suggested the increase. "We will still be the cheapest water/sewer rate of anybody we've studies and we'll still be able to meet our costs." he said. "This should be able to stand on its own. In unrelated business, the board will consult with its attorney about a disputed parcel of land between the village office and property east of the office.

Trustees last month approved erecting a fence between the two properties, moving the fence line to what they considered the legal boundary.

However, Linda Van Burke, co-owner of the property, appeared at Monday's meeting and told trustees that because the property line has not been challenged, the land legally belongs to her under laws of adverse possession.

Van Burke said surveys dating back to 1980 have not been disputed by village officials "and there's nothing that can be changed."

The non-traditional kind include father-of-thebride survival baskets, "welcome to the family" baskets for new sons-in-law and "I'm in the doghouse and I'm sorry" baskets. "I can make a basket to make them forget anything they're mad about." Hayslett said.

Baskets can be filled with flowers and any of several items available in Hayslett's shop, ranging from exotic meats and spices to perfumed candles and gourmet coffces, teas. cookies and chocolate. Hayslett also carries a line of flavored body foams and other items for lovers' baskets.

In creating baskets. Hayslett said she prefers to use as many products made in central Illinois as possible. "When I opened. I made a commitment to that." she said. "I want people to know we have stuff here, too." For example, some baskets include Beebe Stevenson gourmet popcorn.

And she's looking for local crafters of upscale items to include in her handiwork.

Hayslett creates each basket around the person who will receive it, having the purchaser fill out a questionnaire on the recipient. Items filling the basket are based on answers to the questions, as well as the giver's ideas. "If I don't have the stuff in here, I'll go out and find it," she said.

While Hayslett's shop features many types of baskets, "gift baskets don't have to be just baskets," she said.

For example, two popular Father's Day baskets were polystyrene coolers shaped like golf and baseballs. And wicker baby buggies make good "baskets" for expectant parents. Hayslett said.

The average starting price for a basket is \$25. although "whatever they want to spend, I can do something."

She will ship baskets anywhere in the U.S. and can have most ready in an hour.

Creating beautiful baskets is something Hayslett has done only recently. She researched the idea for approximately four months, and has been learning her craft for approximately three
