Aldermen prepare for next landfill expansion vote

Aldermen who have not yet voted on the proposed Illinois Landfills expansion are readying themselves for Tuesday's vote.

The Hoopeston city council will meet in special session at 7 p.m. Tuesday to decide whether the proposed 120-acre expansion will meet the needs of the intended 31-county service area.

The aldermen - David Borders. Harold Cox and Mark Drollinger - all received copies of the transcript from the original siting hearing.

Additionally, the three have examined at least part of the official record, according to a sign-in sheet at the municipal building.

The record includes not only the hearing transcript, but also the original application, submitted exhibits, objectors' testimony and minutes of special council meetings dealing with the landfill.

Borders spent Thursday reviewing the record at the municipal building, poring over the volumes of information.

According to the sign-in sheet, both Drollinger and Cox have examined the table of contents for the record. That document lists the contents of each volume of material.

Additionally, Drollinger said he is reviewing exhibit 13. the original application. "It's a lot of night reading," he said, adding the application is "probably the gut of' the landfill information.

Drollinger said he plans to "go back and check again" on other material in the record.

Cox has viewed the transcript and table of contents, but has not reviewed other parts of the record, according to the sign-in sheet.

The council's original decision to grant the expansion has been upheld on all but the need criterion. Once aldermen make that decision Tuesday, either side may appeal to the Illinois Pollution Control Board.


