Local library patron hopes to form discussion group

You've just finished a book and you've got some very definite ideas about what you've read. You want to share those ideas with someone, but who?

A recently-returned resident wants to provide the answer to that question.

Mark Hanson hopes to start a book discussion group at the Hoopeston Public Library.

The idea came to Hanson for two reasons. First, a book club he is a member of has discounts for discussion groups. Second, he remembers discussion groups of his college years.

The group would read and discuss current books. And, according to Hanson, the more controversial the book, the better.

("The Satanic Verses" by Salman Rushdie) would have been a good choice for discussion," he said, adding that Western cultures are not much different than Iranian religious leaders who put a

price on Rushdie's head. "I think we do it in more subtle ways, if people aren't on the perceived straight and narrow," he said.

Hanson admits to eclectic reading tastes. He is currently reading studies on the New Testament and likes science "as long as it's not too technical. And I just love a good murder mystery. That's where I am today. Next week, it may be basket weaving and Indian history."

The planned group is open to anyone. "some of the best groups I've ever been in have been varied," Hanson said, adding he's looking for "people who've got opinions, aren't afraid to voice them and aren't afraid to let others voice theirs."
