No major problems found in Rossville annual audit

ROSSVILLE—An audit of village books show no major problems in Rossville.

Phyllis Parks of Dougherty & Parks accounting firm, Danville, presented the audit at Monday's village board meeting.

Parks told trustees two areas should be changed. First, she said, financial duties should be segregated.

Currently, clerk Kathy Roark, treasurer Gene Hughes and a part time employee all perform financial duties, said Mayor Merv Smith.

However, officials will delineate specific duties to each employee, with cross checks, he said.

Additionally, Parks suggested changes in appropriations amendment policies, allowing Parks to audit books more easily in the future.

In other action, trustees:

Dapproved spending \$3,862 on a trenching box, a safety device for village workers.

□approved spending \$543 for a police car light bar. Trustees Mick Braddock and Jon Witvoet voted against the purchase, saying most police departments use internal lights.

□approved spending \$2,475 to trim or remove seven trees in the village. Rainwater Tree Service will do the work.

Lawyer discusses hunters, firearms owner ID cards

Editor's Note: The following column is one in a series written by Hoopeston attorneys Calvin Hultquist and Kate Giffin. The columns will run as space allows.

Reader: If I have a hunting license and I go hunting with someone else who has a Firearm Owners Identification (FOI) card and I am using their gun, am I violating the law if I do not have a FOI card?"

Legally D.R.

Yes. There are only a few exceptions | Speaking to this rule, the first being an exception by Calvin Hultquist/ for various federal, state and local law Kate Giffin, attorneys enforcement officials. There are only three other notable exceptions.

First, unemanicpated minors do not need a FOI card when they are hunting with a parent, guardian or responsible adult possessing a valid FOI card.

Second, adult licensed hunters do not need a FOI card when hunting with another licensed hunter who has a valid FOI card when hunting on the premises of a licensed hunting club.

Third, there are special exceptions for out-ofstate hunters hunting in Illinois.

In any case of an exception, all other gun control and hunting laws must be strictly

obeyed.

Applications for FOI cards are available at most police departments. Most adults will be approved for one unless they have a psychiatric disorder or certain criminal convictions.




