Attorney offers legal tips for reeling in the big ones

Editor's Note: The following column was written by Hoopeston attorneys Calvin Hultquist and Kate Giffin. Columns will run as space allows.

Reader: "A creek passes through my Legally property. If I fish the creek from my property, do I need a fishing license?" Speaking

No. Typically, anyone who fishes in by Calvin Hultquist/ Illinois needs a fishing license. How- Kate Giffin, attorneys ever, in the process of researching

your question. I came across some rather interesting exceptions and rules.

First, people fishing on land they own or lease do not need a license as long as they actually live on the land. The exception does not apply to people living on residential developments with other families on the same body of water.

People belonging to fishing clubs, such as Hoopeston's Conservation Club, do need a license to fish there.

Veterans certified by the Veterans Administra-

tion as being ten percent or more disabled do not have to buy a fishing license. Likewise, active military personnel who were Illinois residents

when they enlisted and who are on ordinary leave in Illinois do not need fishing licenses. All other fishing regulations must be followed.

Senior citizens over 65 are entitled to a discounted license.

A fishing license is required to seine for minnows and the minnows captured may only be used for personal bait and may not be sold. A commercial license is required to capture and sell minnows.

A fishing license is required to hunt bullfrogs. Bullfrog season runs from June 15 through Aug. 31.

When fishing, you must have your license with you. You may fish with two poles. Fishing with trot lines and bank poles is legal, but such equip See TIPS on other side
