

Trent Lockhart took first in the 9-10 year old boys' butterfly category while Charissa Snavely took top honors in the 11-12 year old girls' backstroke.


The Hoopeston team competing in the 9-10 year old boys' relay also got first. Relay members were Trent Lockhart, Brandon Snavely, Nicholas

Hoopeston played host for the meet for the first time, and Haggerty said people from other towns commented on how well the meet ran.


"This year, there were a lot of comments," Haggerty said. "People told me and other people that it was a perfect location and that things worked out wonderfully."







