Man awaits arraignment on kidnapping, resisting charges

A Hoopeston man is being held in the Public Safety Building, Danville, awaiting arraignment on charges of kidnapping.

Roland M. Wilson III, 25, of 623 E. Thompson, was arrested at 10:44 p.m. Saturday, charged with kidnapping, armed violence, unlawful use of a weapon, aggravated assault, reckless conduct, aggravated fleeing and eluding, resisting arrest, intimidation and illegal transportation of alcohol.
