

Officer injured in bar call

Hoopeston police officer Roger Beaty was injured slightly when he responded to a call at 1:10 a.m. Saturday at the Second Chance Saloon, 102 N. Market.

According to reports, Beaty was called to the bar for a fight in the parking lot. Beaty tried to arrest Scott J. Ford, no age given, of 830 E. Seminary.

Ford resisted and was subdued before being charged with aggravated battery, resisting arrest and disobeying a police officer. He was taken to the police station, then transferred to the Public Safety Building, Danville.

Beaty drove himself to Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, where he was treated and released. Arrested in connection with the same incident was Angela K. Tull, no age given, of #28, Baer's Trailer Court.

Tull was charged with two counts of aggravated battery. She was booked at the police station, then taken to the Public Safety Building.

Two boys, ages 12 and 15, were arrested at 12:58 a.m. Friday, charged with curfew violation. Both were given notices to appear. One was released to his guardian, the other was taken home.


