

Alderman charges police car battery costs too high

Hoopeston officials are paying too much for police car batteries according to a city official.

At Tuesday's council meeting, alderman Dave Borders questioned a bill of \$105 for a squad car battery from Crown Ford in Hoopeston. "You can get the best battery in the world for less than \$100," he said.

Police chief Orval Kaag said the battery is a heavy duty variety, but added he will check with Crown Ford on the high cost.

In related business, the council approved three new auxilary police officers.

Pat Clingenpeel, George Smith and Greg Cushman were approved by a 6-1 vote.

Borders, the only dissenter, would not say why he voted against the appointments. "I don't want to comment on that," he said. "They were voted in and now I'm behind them."

In other business, the council:

discussed repairs at the water treatment plant are underway. New electronic systems are being installed and are expected to decrease rust in city water.

Former Rossville man falls (head over heels) in movie

ROSSVILLE—A former resident fell head over heels - literally and figuratively - while working on a major movie.

Billy Morts, son of Lloyd and Susie Morts of Rossville worked as a stuntman in the movie "Waterworld," currently playing at the Lorraine Theatre in Hoopeston.

Morts spent five months in Hawaii working on the film, as a stuntman for the movie's star, Kevin Costner. "He's in it in different places but I don't know where," Mrs. Morts said, adding she saw the picture when it opened at the Lorraine last week.

While working on the film, the stuntman met and fell in love with Tammy Brady Conrad. daughter of actor Robert Conrad. The two were married July 8, Mrs. Morts said.

Besides acting as stuntman, Morts also did a great deal of rigging for action scenes in the movie, she said.

"Waterworld" is not the first film Morts has worked on. He has more than 50 movies to his credit, including "Speed," where he did scenes under a speeding bus and on top of a train.

He is currently working on a film with Christian Slater and John Travolta titled "Broken Arrow," Mrs. Morts said.

Morts' desire to become a stuntman started when he was about nine years old, Mrs. Morts said. He headed to California after graduating from high school to pursue his dream and has been practicing stunt work for approximately 12 years.

Once in California, Morts attended stuntman's school and is the only member of his class currently in the profession, Mrs. Morts said.

Mrs. Morts and her husband are proud of their son, even though his profession is not one they would have chosen for him. 'He didn't turn out to be the farmer we wanted," she said.
