Accuracy important in reporting crimes: dispatcher

While police have primary responsibility for keeping Hoopeston safe, residents can do their part.

That was the message from Hoopeston police dispatcher George Smith who spoke at Monday's Neighborhood Watch meeting.

The most important thing for residents is be specific when describing a suspect or giving directions for an ambulance, Smith said.

"From the top down" was the advice Smith gave, whether describing suspects or vehicles.

Residents should be aware of the sex, race, age, height and weight of a suspect, as well as the color of hair and eyes, complexion, and whether the suspect has scars, markings, or other unusual characteristics, such as walking with a limp.

Clothing is also important, including the color and type.

To prove his point, Smith had those attending describe auxiliary officer Bill McClaflin, who was present at the meeting, then left.

When identifying vehicles, Smith said residents should give the color, year, if possible, make and model or size, body type and license.

Direction of travel is also important, Smith said, saying residents should use north, south, east or west, not left and right.

Accuracy is also important when calling 911 to request an ambulance. Smith gave examples of two 911 calls in which callers wasted precious time by not giving complete directions. Differentiating between streets and avenues is also important locally, Smith said.

The next Neighborhood Watch meeting will be at 7 p.m. Sept. 25 at the Hoopeston municipal building.




