Lawyer compares no-fault, mental cruelty divorce criteria

The most common basis for divorce in Illinois is "mental cruelty." In many ways, mental cruelty is not unlike a "no fault" divorce because mental cruelty is in the eves of the beholder. Mental cruelty ranges from sever Legally psychological abuse of a spouse to more benighn conduct, such as a Speaking spouse being depressed, moody or by Calvin Hultquist/ critical. public, attorneys and even judges do not recognize much of a stigma resulting from divorce based on mental cruelty. Most people recognize that a divorce is rarely the fault of one party to a marriage exclusively.

For those who desire a no-fault divorce, the law requires that a couple live separate and apart for a period of two years; however, if both sign an

affidavit waiving the two-year separation requirement, a no-fault divorce can be granted after a sixmonth separation.

A no-fault divorce is premised upon irreconcilable differences arising between the parties which

cannot be resolved despite their best efforts.

Many attorneys advise clients whose spouses have filed for divorce based on mental cruelty not to fight the issue because it really does not create See **DIVORCE** on other side


