The Hoopeston city council will once again seek housing grants to modernize homes of low-income residents.

Alderman Dave Borders, chairman of the city's civic improvement committee, announced at Tuesday's council meeting that the city will spend \$1,500 to reapply for a housing rehabilitation grant which could total more than \$400,000.

Officials applied for the state grant last year and were rejected.
