## Clinton speech 'awesome' says former local resident

President Clinton's visit to Southern Illinois University Monday was an "awesome, awesome experience"for a local man.

Matthew Parsons, an SIU graduate was among a handful of student leaders who sat near Clinton during his 30-minute speech Monday.

Clinton, along with Sen. Paul Simon, addressed approximately 15,000 people in Carbondale, speaking about the federal budget and specifically, federal student aid.

Clinton's financial aid plan includes Simon's initiative of direct lending and a component which would provide deductions for college tuition. "That's a very solid idea that has a lot of bi-partisan support," Parsons said. "It's very hard to debate his plan on higher education. It's hard to argue against education."

Clinton panned Republicans, Parsons said, because of the recently-approved \$12 billion spent on B-2 bombers and suggested cuts in financial aid. "He said that money could have gone to education," Parsons said.

Clinton's financial aid suggestions were not the only thing that impressed Parsons. "I've never seen a person who could captivate a large audience like (Clinton)," he said. "He is a master at working a crowd. He has charisma."

Parsons, who served as SIU chief of staff and ran for mayor of Carbondale, called the visit a look at "the pretty side, the polished side" of politics, saying the visit was "an overwhelming production."

Parsons was especially impressed with the priority given to students during Clinton's visit. An elementary class was given front-row seats and college students were given priority, as well. "That was an amazing thing to me," he said. "After what I've seen the last couple years, it was great to see the president of the United States say students are important."

Simon also got high marks from Parsons. "If there's one political figure in this country who fascinates me, it's him," he said, adding Simon

# Hoopeston man faces felony charges in shooting incident

A Hoopeston man was arraigned Wednesday on felony charges stemming from the Sept. 1 shooting of a Glenview man.

Edward H. Lockhart of rural Hoopeston was arraigned on charges of aggravated battery with a firearm, a Class X felony; aggravated discharge of a firearm, a Class 1 felony; and reckless discharge of a firearm, a Class 4 felony.

The charges stem from a Sept. 1 incident when Lockhart allegedly shot Alex Assinocopicias of

Glenview. Assinocopicias, who was hunting with a friend, was shot in the wrist and back of the neck.

According to Gary Miller, Vermilion County Sheriff's Department chief investigator, Assinocopicias was shot with buckshot or bird shot in an alleged disagreement over hunting.

Lockhart was released on 10 percent of \$5,000 bond. If convicted of the Class X felony, he faces up to six years in prison.


