

A local pharmacy is among drug stores across the country protesting having to swallow a bitter pill.

Weber's Drug Store will participate in a nationwide protest, beginning at noon Wednesday, aimed at curtailing insurance company interference in the workings of local pharmacies.

The protest, sponsored by the National Association of Retail Druggists, will include dimming lights and darkening windows. The goal is to draw attention to the plight of small drug stores, said Weber's owner, Roger Ball, R.Ph.

Insurance companies sign contracts with major pharmacies, allowing insureds to purchase drugs for a low co-payment, usually \$5 or \$10, Ball said.

Insurance company customers use the selected pharmacies and pay low prices or use a nonselected pharmacy and pay significantly more for prescriptions.

The practice is unfair, Ball said, because small stores are not chosen by insurance companies. And, he added, owners of small stores are more likely to provide 24-hour service than major chains. "They're more concerned with cost, not care," Ball said. "what's going to happen if there's a call in the middle of the night and nobody's home?"
