City workers at Floral Hill Cemetery will continue to work without a pick up truck.

The Hoopeston city council voted 7-1 Tuesday night not to purchase a 1988 Chevrolet half-ton truck for not more than \$6,100.

Council member Susan Comstock, chairman of the cemetery committee, recommended the purchase, saying she has looked for a truck for over a year without success. "They're hard to come by," she said. "I went to look at everything (potential sellers) had and it was junk."

While Comstock favored the purchase, members of her committee did not.

Officials of Illinois Landfills, Inc., owners of the landfill in Hoopeston, have requested city assistance in working out a compromise with landfill expansion opponents.

Mayor Bob Ault said at Tuesday's council meeting that the landfill company has requested city input in discussing possible compromises to the planned 120-acre expansion of the existing site. "I don't know all the details, but it concerns compromises ILI is proposing to different people in town," Ault said.

Ault appointed the finance committee, including aldermen Bill Goodwine, Drew Allen and Mark Drollinger, to work with ILI and opponents.

Mabel said she has 1035 plants, not counting the varieties of annual flowers.

yard. Last year, she said, 141 people visited her vard.

Groups also appreciate the beauty. The Garden Club has met there and senior citizens have come to have pictures taken. Charlene Ervin, marketing director of Country Terrace Apartments, brought residents to Mabel's home last week, where everyone enjoyed an afternoon party in the garden.

Mabel, a young 81, took up gardening in 1970 after the death of her husband. She does all of her own yard work, including mowing, and said the secret of her flower success is digging up plants at the end of the season, using bone meal in the soil, and working the soil up thoroughly.

In June, the council reapproved the expansion. Opponents appealed the decision to the Pollution Control Board, but have said compromise is possible.

Truck continued from other side three local garages and a bank to find prices on a

similar truck. The garages estimated the cost at under \$5,000, Borders said, while the bank put one in the range of \$5,500.

Committee member John Haughee also voted against the purchase.
